HE IS RISEN!



Christ the Lord is risen today! Allehuia!

With this proclamation, Christians worldwide joyfully declare the reason for our jubilation today: the Resurrection of Christ is our resurrection, and his triumph over death is our triumph. People ask why, in the Catholic Church, we don't keep the Sabbath (Saturday) if it was prescribed in the law of Moses: "Observe the Sabbath day, to keep it holy, as the Lord your God commanded you" (Dt. 5:12) and "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it Holy" (Ex 20-8). However, for us who have accepted Christ as our Messiah, Sunday is the first day of the week that marks His glorious resurrection as His victory over death.

Today is the greatest of all Sundays in the Christian calendar because of the profound newness of life that it brings. Today, a new epoch has completely begun. This is because the historical Jesus, who suffered, was crucified, died, and was buried, has now been glorified.

The short story is that Christ has risen, fulfilling his promise: "I will rise on the third day." The battle is over. There is no controversy because Jesus is Lord! Today, we celebrate the unequivocal triumph of good over evil, light over darkness, and peace over chaos. We celebrate hope, patience, and the fulfillment of God's Promise to his people. We also celebrate the exceptionality of our religion: our Lord's resurrection. Through his resurrection, Jesus affirms that he is the Lord of the living and the dead.

Like Paul, today our song should be that of thanksgiving to God: "We bless God the Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ who in his great mercy has given us a new birth...by raising Jesus Christ from the dead." This is because Christ's death was our death, and his resurrection is ours, too. Therefore, his joy, glory, and triumph are equally ours.

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SAINT OF THE WEEK: MARK EVANGELIST



Most of what we know about Mark comes directly from the New Testament. He is usually identified with the Mark of Acts 12:12. When St. Peter escaped from prison, he went to the home of Mark's mother.

Paul and Barnabas took him along on the first missionary journey, but Mark returned alone to Jerusalem for some reason. From Paul's refusal to let Mark accompany him on the second journey despite Barnabas's insistence, it is evident that Mark had displeased Paul. Because Paul later asks Mark to visit him in prison, we may assume the trouble did not last long.

The oldest and the shortest of the four Gospels, the Gospel of Mark emphasizes Jesus's rejection by humanity while being God's triumphant envoy. Probably written for Gentile converts in Rome—after the death of Peter and Paul sometime between A.D. 60 and 70—Mark's Gospel is the gradual manifestation of a "scandal": a crucified Messiah.

Evidently, a friend of Mark—calling him "my son"—Peter is only one of this Gospel's sources, the others being the Church in Jerusalem (Jewish roots) and the Church at Antioch (largely Gentile).

Like another Gospel writer, Luke, Mark was not among the 12 apostles. We cannot be certain whether he knew Jesus personally. Some scholars feel that the evangelist is speaking of himself when describing the arrest of Jesus in Gethsemane: "Now a young man followed him wearing nothing but a linen cloth about his body. They seized him, but he left the cloth behind and ran off naked" (Mark 14:51-52).

Others hold Mark to be the first bishop of Alexandria, Egypt. Venice, famous for the Piazza San Marco, claims Mark as its patron saint; the large basilica there is believed to contain his remains.

A winged lion is Mark's symbol. The lion derives from Mark's description of John the Baptist as a "voice of one crying out in the desert" (Mark 1:3), which artists compared to a roaring lion. The wings come from the application of Ezekiel's vision of four-winged creatures to the evangelists.

Reflection: Mark fulfilled in his life what every Christian is called to do: proclaim the Good News that is the source of salvation to all people. In particular, Mark's way was by writing. Others may proclaim the Good News by music, drama, poetry, or teaching children around a family table.



MARY MAGDALENE, THE FIRST WITNESS

Mary Magdalene is broken and in pain; Jesus has ended up tortured and crucified, and she finds no consolation. She needs to get closer to the grave where they have put him. She needs to grieve. She needs the closeness of the dead body of Jesus. Mary loves Jesus dearly and doesn't want to leave him; she doesn't shut herself up at home. She puts herself in a situation where she will not be seized by the fear of the executors of her friend and her Lord Jesus. Mary approaches at dawn and finds that the place of death is empty.

Peter and his companion run to the tomb when Mary Magdalene tells them that the body of Jesus is not where they have put it. Something strange is happening around the tomb

of Jesus. There is confusion; everything is in order, but he is not in the place of the dead. It seems that it has not been another misdeed of the tomb robbers; the canvases are folded, and there is no damage.

Peter enters, and before the emptiness, he does not react. Instead, his companion, who arrived first, enters and believes. Peter is still dazed and blocked by his abandonment and denial. He needs time. His companion, the favorite disciple of Jesus, the one who most understood Jesus from the heart, begins to open up to the Life of the Risen One. Each follower of Jesus will go through the process of passing from death to life. The Living One does not impose himself; he does not overwhelm; he does not show himself in pageantry and splendor. He will lead his own so that each one makes his "way to Emmaus" in his own way and manner. St. Ignatius will tell us that he shows himself to us "sweetly, lightly, and gently."

For the beloved disciple, it is enough to see the emptiness of the tomb to perceive that death has not had the last word on Jesus, that the "body" of Jesus is now the fullness of life together with the Father who has raised Him from the dead, who is now next to the God of Life. Peter will need a little more time, but he will need the Lord to return to him with a word of encouragement and strength.

Only the empty tomb alone does not lead to recognizing the Living One, "they have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we do not know where they have put him." On the one hand, they are disconcerted because it seems that the body of Jesus, the bodies of his creatures, is not doomed to become manure, that the emptiness of the tomb disturbs them. From this confusion, they begin to understand that "death does not rule" and are getting ready for the Encounter.

¡HA RESUCITADO!



¡Crísto el Señor ha resucitado hoy! ¡Aleluya!

Con esta proclamación, los cristianos de todo el mundo declaramos con alegría el motivo de nuestro júbilo de hoy: la Resurrección de Cristo es nuestra resurrección, y su triunfo sobre la muerte es nuestro triunfo. La gente se pregunta por qué, en la Iglesia Católica, no guardamos el sábado si así lo prescribió la ley de Moisés: «Guarda el día de reposo para santificarlo, como el Señor tu Dios te lo ordenó» (Dt 5,12) y «Acuérdate del día de reposo para santificarlo» (Éx 20-8). Sin embargo, para quienes hemos aceptado a Cristo como nuestro Mesías, el domingo es el primer día de la semana que conmemora su gloriosa resurrección como su victoria sobre la muerte.

Hoy es el domingo más grande del calendario cristiano por la profunda novedad de vida que trae consigo. Hoy ha comenzado una nueva época. Esto se debe a que el Jesús histórico, quien sufrió, fue crucificado, murió y fue sepultado, ahora ha sido glorificado.

En resumen, Cristo resucitó, cumpliendo su promesa: «Resucitaré al tercer día». La batalla ha terminado. No hay controversia porque Jesús es el Señor. Hoy celebramos el triunfo inequívoco del bien sobre el mal, de la luz sobre las tinieblas y de la paz sobre el caos. Celebramos la esperanza, la paciencia y el cumplimiento de la promesa de Dios a su pueblo. También celebramos la excepcionalidad de nuestra religión: la resurrección de nuestro Señor. A través de ella, Jesús afirma que es el Señor de los vivos y de los muertos.

Al igual que Pablo, hoy nuestro canto debe ser de agradecimiento a Dios: «Bendecimos a Dios, Padre de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, que en su gran misericordia nos ha dado un nuevo nacimiento... resucitando a Jesucristo de entre los muertos». Esto se debe a que la muerte de Cristo fue nuestra muerte, y su resurrección también lo es. Por lo tanto, su alegría, gloria y triunfo son igualmente nuestros.
