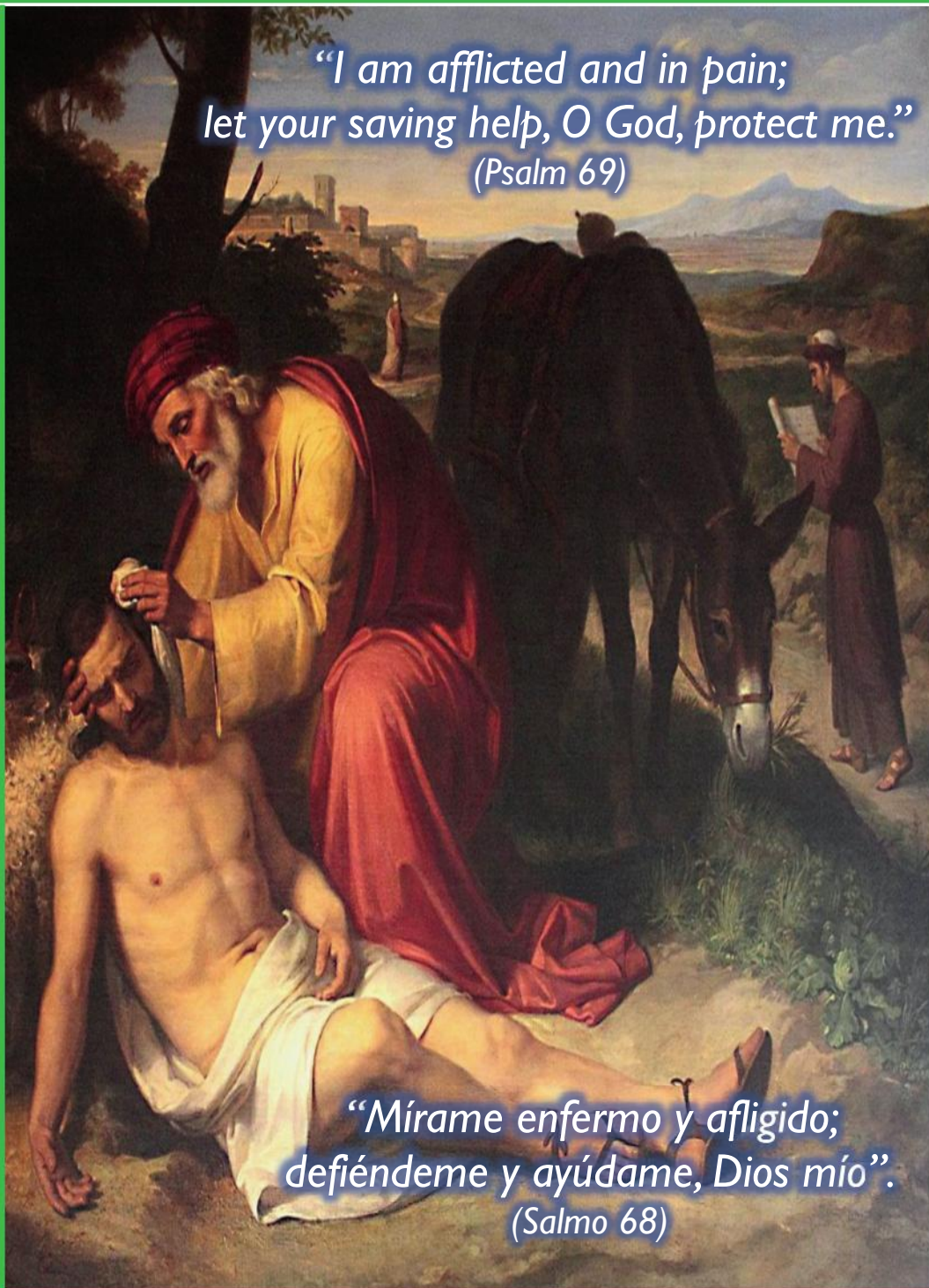

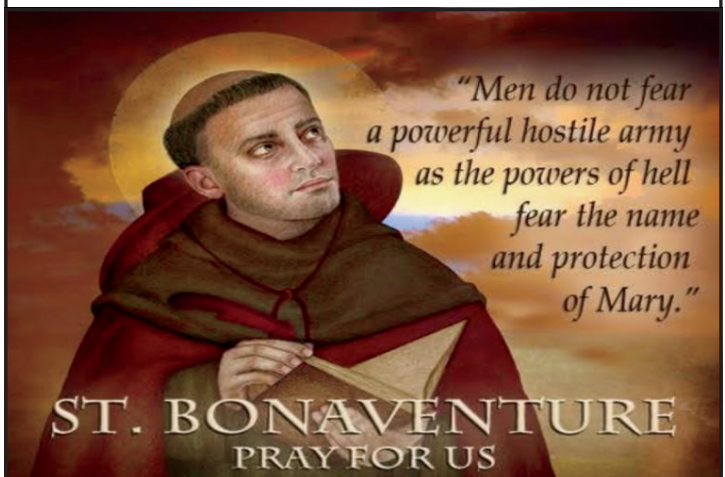

ST. BONAVENTURE PRAY FOR US

THE GOOD SAMARITAN



Today, we celebrate the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, with the Gospel reading coming from St. Luke. The Church Fathers provide a profound interpretation of this beautiful Gospel passage, viewing it as an allegory that represents fallen humanity, as well as Jesus and the Church.

In this interpretation, the man represents Adam, symbolizing fallen humanity who has been expelled from the Garden of Eden, which is described in the story as Jerusalem. He is making his way down to Jericho, signifying our earthly existence. The robbers in the story symbolize the devil and his evil companions, who strip the man of his dignity, beat him, and leave him for dead in his sinfulness.

The priest and the Levite represent the Old Testament priesthood and ministry, which could not lead fallen humanity to salvation or restore a relationship with God. In contrast, the Samaritan embodies Jesus, who loves us so deeply that He became one of us to save us. He brings with Him the Sacraments, symbolized by the oil and wine He uses to heal the man's wounds. The inn, where the man is taken, represents the Church—a place where he can continue to be healed until he is ready to return to God.

As members of the Church who are healed through the Sacraments, we are called to carry on Jesus' healing ministry until His return. It is our responsibility to seek out those who are suffering and in need of help, and with the love of God, bring them to the Church so they also can be healed. Once they are healed, they are encouraged to help others experience God's love and mercy.

As Pope St. Paul VI reminds us in his document "Evangelization in the Modern World," "Finally, the person who has been evangelized goes on to evangelize others. Here lies the test of truth, the touchstone of evangelization: it is unthinkable that a person should accept the Word and give himself to the kingdom without becoming a person who bears witness to it and proclaims it in his turn" (EN #24).

Therefore, we must go out into the world and bring others to the Church so that we can all be united as one.

Seats are available in the following programs:

1. Kindergarten and Grade 1: Intro to the Catholic Faith

While a student will not receive a sacrament at the conclusion of these classes, they are recommended as the most appropriate starting point for a child's formal formation in the Catholic faith.

2. Grades 2-5: formal preparation that leads to receiving the sacrament of Holy Communion

3. Grades 3-6: Continuing Faith Formation program

If your child has already received the sacrament of Holy Communion, these classes are highly recommended as they form the perfect bridge between receiving the sacrament of Holy Communion and the start of your child's formal preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation.

A NOTE TO PARENTS WITH STUDENTS ENTERING GRADES NOT LISTED

It is not unusual for seats to become available in classes once considered full.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

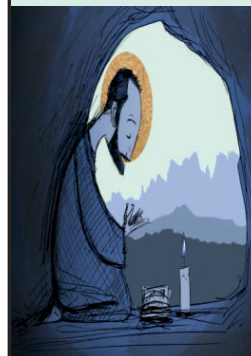
Members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul at St. Ann's are working hard to provide essential food to our neighbors in need. In addition to receiving food through private contributions, our food procurement team collects donated food six days a week from local grocery stores and a USDA food distribution location. Most recently, for the month of June, we served a weekly average of 936 people from 216 families.



Besides providing food, our interviewing team responds to requests for financial assistance that are received through our website. In June, we helped 13 families with utility bills and six with housing assistance. Our home visit teams also visited five families. We are very grateful for the donations of food and the financial support we receive from the parishioners of St. Ann. With your help, we are able to meet the needs of those we serve. SAINT OF THE WEEK: BONAVENTURE



Perhaps not a household name for most people, St. Bonaventure, nevertheless, played an important role in both the medieval Church and the history of the Franciscan Order. A senior faculty member at the University of Paris, St. Bonaventure, certainly captured the hearts of his students with his exceptional academic skills and profound insights. But more importantly, he captured their hearts through his Franciscan love for Jesus and the Church. Like his model, St. Francis, Jesus was the center of everything—his teaching, administration, writing, and life. So much so that he was given the title “Seraphic Doctor.”

Born in Bagnoregio in 1221, St. Bonaventure was baptized John but received the name Bonaventure when he became a Franciscan at 22. Little is known about his childhood, but we do know that his parents were Giovanni di Fianza and Maria Ritell. It seems that his father was a physician and a man of means. While St. Francis died about five years after the saint’s birth, he is credited with healing Bonaventure as a boy of a serious illness.

St. Bonaventure’s teaching career came to a halt when the Friars elected him to serve as their General Minister. His 17 years of service were difficult as the Order was embroiled in conflicts over the interpretation of poverty. Some friars even ended up in heresy, saying that St. Francis and his community were inaugurating the era of the Holy Spirit, which was to replace Jesus, the Church, and Scripture. But because he was a man of prayer and a good administrator, St. Bonaventure managed to structure the Order through effective legislation. But more importantly, he offered the Friars an organized spirituality based on the vision and insights of St. Francis. Always a Franciscan at heart and a mystical writer, Bonaventure managed to unite the pastoral, practical aspects of life with the doctrines of the Church. Thus, a noticeable warmth to his teachings and writings makes him very appealing.

Shortly before he ended his service as General Minister, Pope Gregory X created him a Cardinal and appointed him bishop of Albano. But a little over a year later, while participating in the Second Council of Lyon, St. Bonaventure died suddenly on July 15, 1274. There is a theory that he was poisoned.

St. Bonaventure left behind a structured and renewed Franciscan Order and a body of work, all of which glorifies his major love—Jesus.

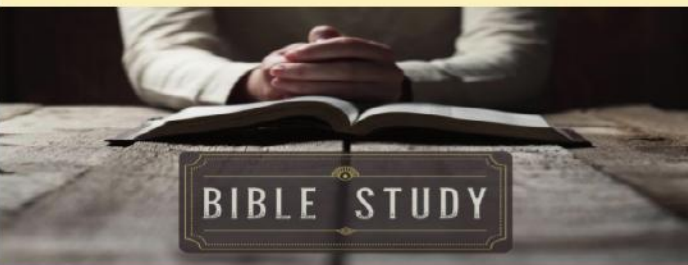

EL BUEN SAMARITANO



Hoy celebramos el Decimoquinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, con la lectura del Evangelio según San Lucas. Los Padres de la Iglesia ofrecen una profunda interpretación de este hermoso pasaje evangélico, considerándolo una alegoría que representa a la humanidad caída, así como a Jesús y a la Iglesia.

En esta interpretación, el hombre representa a Adán, que simboliza a la humanidad caída, expulsada del Jardín del Edén, descrito en la historia como Jerusalén. Se dirige a Jericó, representando nuestra existencia terrenal. Los ladrones en la historia simbolizan al diablo y sus malvados compañeros, quienes despojan al hombre de su dignidad, lo golpean y lo abandonan por muerto en su pecado.

El sacerdote y el levita representan el sacerdocio y el ministerio del Antiguo Testamento, que no pudieron guiar a la humanidad caída a la salvación ni restaurar su relación con Dios. En contraste, el samaritano encarna a Jesús, quien nos ama tan profundamente que se hizo uno de nosotros para salvarnos. Trae consigo los sacramentos, simbolizados por el aceite y el vino que usa para sanar las heridas del hombre. La posada, adonde lo llevan, representa a la Iglesia, un lugar donde puede seguir sanando hasta que esté listo para volver a Dios.

Como miembros de la Iglesia que sanamos mediante los sacramentos, estamos llamados a continuar el ministerio sanador de Jesús hasta su regreso. Es nuestra responsabilidad buscar a quienes sufren y necesitan ayuda, y con el amor de Dios, llevarlos a la Iglesia para que también puedan sanar. Una vez sanados, se les anima a ayudar a otros a experimentar el amor y la misericordia de Dios.

Como nos recuerda el Papa San Pablo VI en su documento "La evangelización en el mundo moderno", «Finalmente, quien ha sido evangelizado continúa evangelizando a otros. Aquí reside la prueba de la verdad, la piedra de toque de la evangelización: es impensable que una persona acepte la Palabra y se entregue al reino sin convertirse, a su vez, en una persona que la testimonia y la proclama» (EN #24).

Por lo tanto, debemos salir al mundo y llevar a otros a la Iglesia para que todos podamos estar unidos como uno solo.

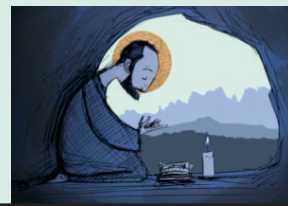

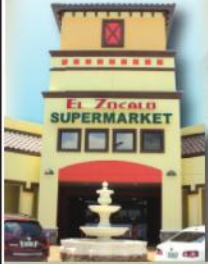
