ANNOUNCE AND DENOUNCE



In the Old Testament, the Prophet Amos was a simple and humble man who, having no tradition of prophets or priests in his family, was just a shepherd and caretaker of sycamore-fig trees. He became one of the twelve Minor Prophets. By the way, some are called Minor Prophets not because they are of smaller importance but because their books are shorter than those of the Major Prophets, such as Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Daniel.

Amos lived around 750 years before Jesus and about 250 years after the nation of Israel had been divided into two: Judah in the south and Israel in the north. He was born in Tekoa, a town in Judah about six miles south of Bethlehem, but for the most part, he preached in Israel. Other prophets such as Jonah, Hosea, Micah, and Isaiah also prophesied around this time.

It is believed that Amos appeared at a time of great economic prosperity, political stability, religious fervor, and relative peace in the kingdom of Israel, which reminded them of the golden age of David and his son Solomon two hundred years earlier. Still, at the same time, it was a period when a lack of honesty and integrity, a lack of moral conscience and social compassion, and a lack of spiritual devotion and reverence for God's Law prevailed.

There was little connection between the people's religious exercises and their daily lives. There was religiosity among them, but no righteousness. Increased prosperity had led them to pride, selfishness, greed, exploitation, oppression, materialism, contempt for the poor, and disregard for justice. They were observing all the religious rituals and ceremonies laid down by Moses, while their hearts were far from God (Isaiah 29:13). They had become morally and spiritually godless and corrupt. They had become as evil as Sodom and Gomorrah in God's sight (Amos 4:11).

Today, the Church needs many prophets like Amos, who proclaim the good news of salvation and denounce sin and, when necessary, remind us of the importance of returning to God. Since our baptism, when we were anointed as priests, prophets, and kings, we have all been called to fulfill the mission entrusted to us by God in the world in which we live.

BIBLE CLASSES

We are blessed to offer a new opportunity for ongoing Catholic formation on different aspects of the foundation of our faith. These sessions will be taught by Bernard Byrne, a gifted teacher with a rich background in theology and pastoral ministry.



About the Instructor:

Bernard was born in Ireland and entered the seminary in Dublin. He studied philosophy and theology in Rome, where he was ordained to the priesthood. After several years of ministry in South America, Pope Benedict XVI granted him a dispensation from the law of celibacy. Today, Bernard is a faithful practicing Catholic, married for twenty-five years, and the father of two children. His knowledge, faith, and life experience bring a unique depth to his teaching.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST. VINCENT DE PAUL



The deathbed confession of a dying servant opened Vincent de Paul's eyes to the crying spiritual needs of the peasantry of France. This seems to have been a crucial moment in the life of the man from a small farm in Gascony, France, who had become a priest with little more ambition than a comfortable life.

The Countess de Gondi—whose servant he had helped—persuaded her husband to endow and support a group of able and zealous missionaries who would work among poor tenant farmers and country people. Vincent was too humble to accept leadership at first. But after working for some time in Paris among imprisoned galley slaves, he returned to be the leader of what is now known as the Congregation of the Mission, or the Vincentians. With vows of poverty, chastity, obedience, and stability, these priests were to devote themselves entirely to the people in smaller towns and villages.

Later, Vincent established confraternities of charity for the spiritual and physical relief of the poor and sick in each parish. With the help of St. Louise de Marillac, from these came the Daughters of Charity, “whose convent is the sickroom, whose chapel is the parish church, whose cloister is the streets of the city.” He organized the rich women of Paris to collect funds for his missionary projects, founded several hospitals, collected relief funds for the victims of war, and ransomed over 1,200 galley slaves from North Africa. He was zealous in conducting retreats for clergy at a time when there was great laxity, abuse, and ignorance among them. He was a pioneer in clerical training and was instrumental in establishing seminaries. Pope Leo XIII made him the patron of all charitable societies. Outstanding among these is the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, founded in 1833 by his admirer, Blessed Frédéric Ozanam.

Reflection: The Church is for all God's children, rich and poor, peasants and scholars, the sophisticated and the simple. But obviously, the greatest concern of the Church must be for those who need the most help—those made helpless by sickness, poverty, ignorance, or cruelty. Vincent de Paul is a particularly appropriate patron for all Christians today when hunger has become starvation, and the high living of the rich stands in more and more glaring contrast to the physical and moral degradation in which many of God's children are forced to live.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society continuously assists the community with various programs targeting the most vulnerable and in most need. SVDP delivers various resources and services to provide shelter, food, safety, material and financial assistance, and other tangible help to those experiencing homelessness and poverty.

NEW CARPET INSTALLATION

We are blessed to announce that our church has installed **new carpeting**, renewing the beauty and reverence of our sacred space.

This improvement was not just cosmetic; it was an act of **stewardship and faith**. The carpet we replaced had served for many years, enduring the footsteps of countless parishioners and pilgrims who came to worship and pray. Today, the new carpet helps to create a sacred environment that uplifts our liturgy and reflects the dignity of our worship.

The total investment for this project was **\$24,400**. This was a significant expense, but one that reflects our parish's commitment to maintaining and enhancing the house of God.

We want to express our heartfelt **gratitude** to all who contribute through weekly offertory, special donations, and fundraising. Every gift makes projects like this possible, and every effort strengthens the mission of our parish.

ANUNCIAR Y DENUNCIAR



En el Antiguo Testamento, el profeta Amós era un hombre sencillo y humilde que, al no tener tradición de profetas ni sacerdotes en su familia, se limitaba a pastorear y cuidar sicómoros. Se convirtió en uno de los doce Profetas Menores. A propósito, algunos son llamados Profetas Menores no por su menor importancia, sino porque sus libros son más breves que los de los Profetas Mayores, como Isaías, Jeremías, Ezequiel y Daniel.

Amós vivió unos 750 años antes de Jesús y unos 250 años después de que la nación de Israel se dividiera en dos: Judá al sur e Israel al norte. Nació en Tecoá, un pueblo de Judá a unos 9 kilómetros al sur de Belén, pero la mayor parte de su tiempo predicó en Israel. Otros profetas como Jonás, Oseas, Miqueas e Isaías también profetizaron en esta época. Se cree que Amós apareció en una época de gran prosperidad económica, estabilidad política, fervor religioso y relativa paz en el reino de Israel, lo que les recordaba la época dorada de David y su hijo Salomón doscientos años antes. Sin embargo, al mismo tiempo, fue un período en el que prevalecieron la falta de honestidad e integridad, la falta de conciencia moral y compasión social, y la falta de devoción espiritual y reverencia por la Ley de Dios.

Había poca conexión entre las prácticas religiosas del pueblo y su vida cotidiana. Había religiosidad entre ellos, pero no rectitud. La creciente prosperidad los había llevado al orgullo, el egoísmo, la codicia, la explotación, la opresión, el materialismo, el desprecio por los pobres y el desprecio por la justicia. Observaban todos los rituales y ceremonias religiosas prescritos por Moisés, mientras que sus corazones estaban lejos de Dios (Isaías 29:13). Se habían vuelto moral y espiritualmente impíos y corruptos. Se habían vuelto tan malvados como Sodoma y Gomorra a los ojos de Dios (Amós 4:11).

Hoy, la Iglesia necesita muchos profetas como Amós, que proclamen la buena nueva de salvación, denuncien el pecado y, cuando sea necesario, nos recuerden la importancia de volver a Dios. Desde nuestro bautismo, cuando fuimos ungidos como sacerdotes, profetas y reyes, todos hemos sido llamados a cumplir la misión que Dios nos confió en el mundo en que vivimos.

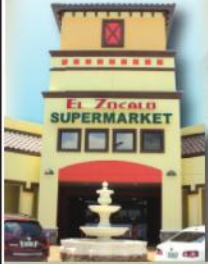
